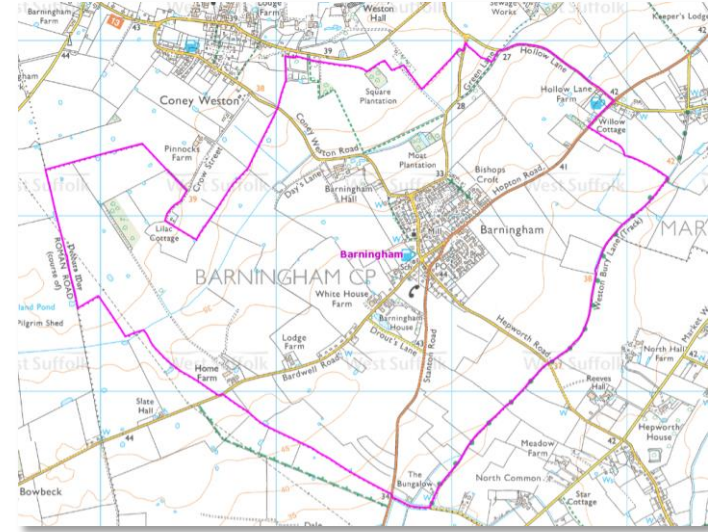

## Barningham Neighbourhood Plan

- It is a new kind of planning document
- It can guide the development and conservation of the village.
- It can, for example, also identify proposals for:
  - Improving areas;
  - Providing new facilities;
  - Sites for new development;
  - Protecting sites of environmental or historic quality;
- Not just about Development
- Designed to allow local people to play an active part in planning their area.
  - Requires a survey of residents' views

- We distributed 402 questionnaires to residents of the parish
- 203 questionnaires were returned either on paper or via Survey-Monkey

## Participation Rate



- Each Questionnaire contained 60 questions (plus a comments section)
- With 203 questionnaires completed, there were 12,383 potential answers
- The total number of questions answered was 6,920

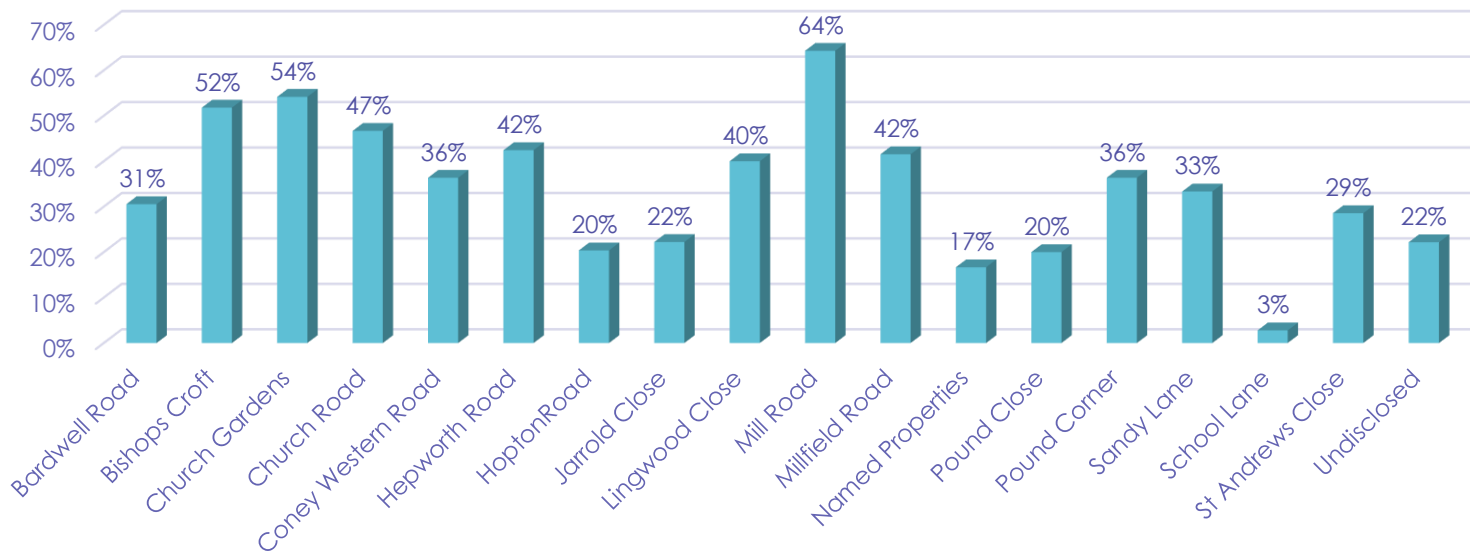

Distribution of returns



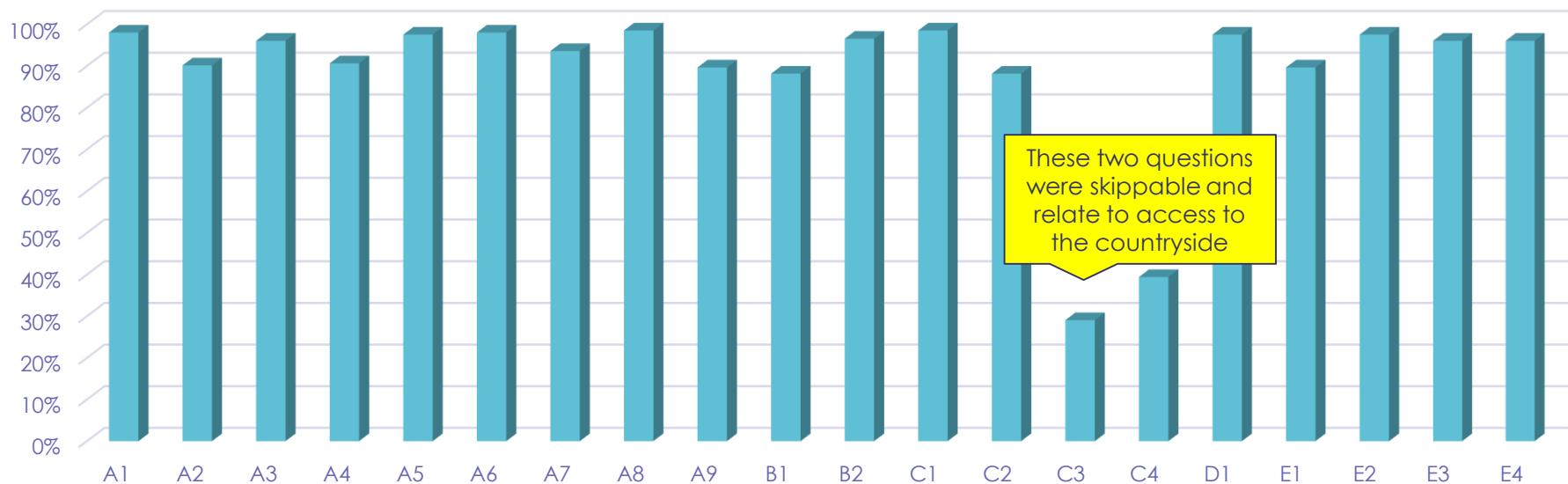

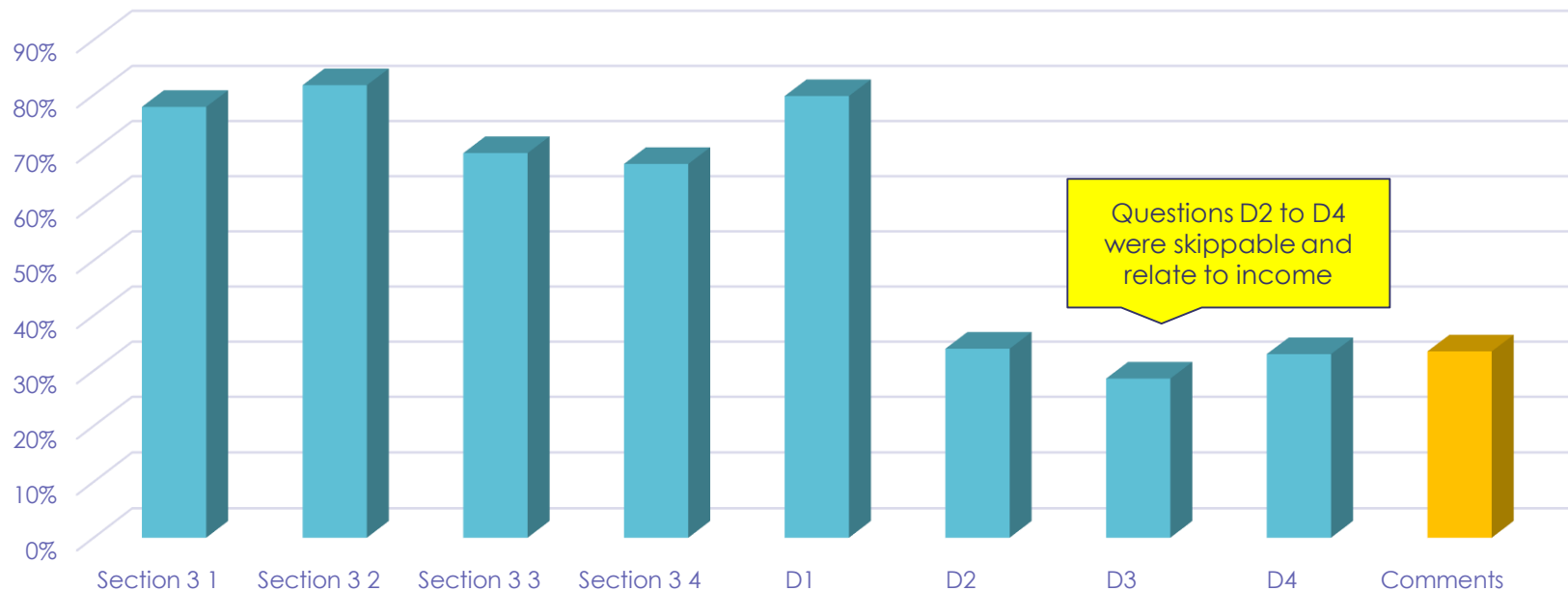

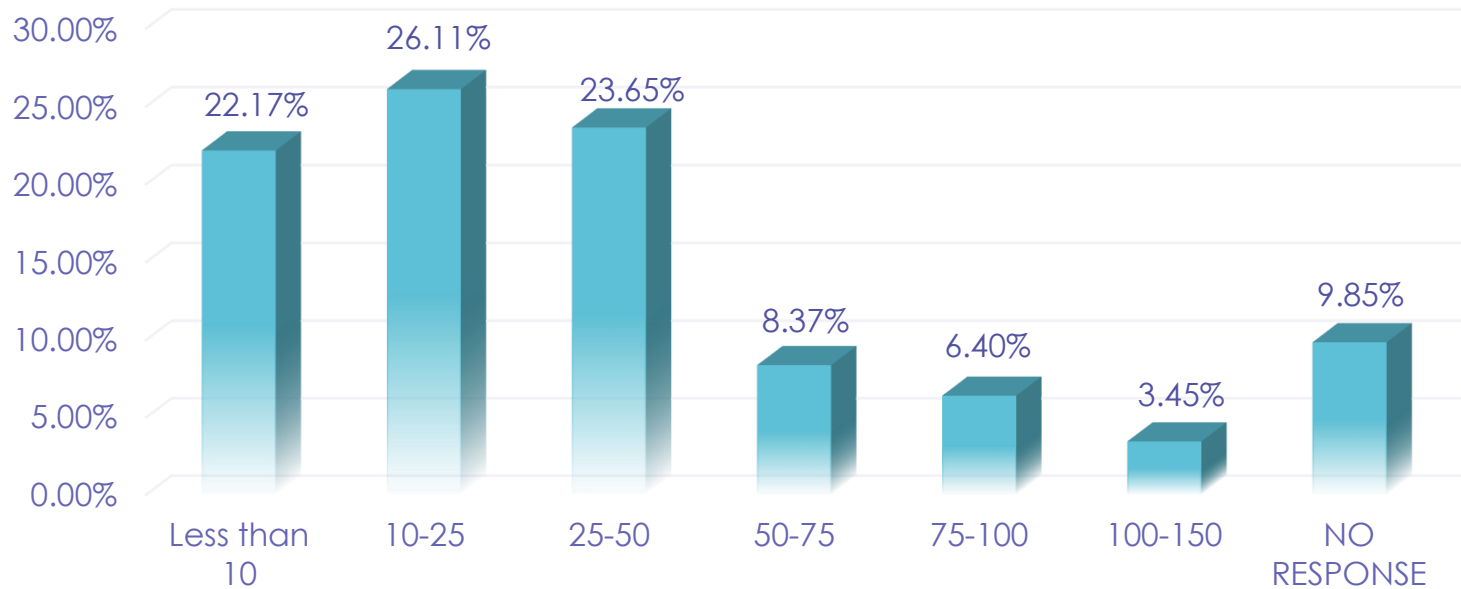

## NUMBER OF HOUSES THAT SHOULD BE BUILT

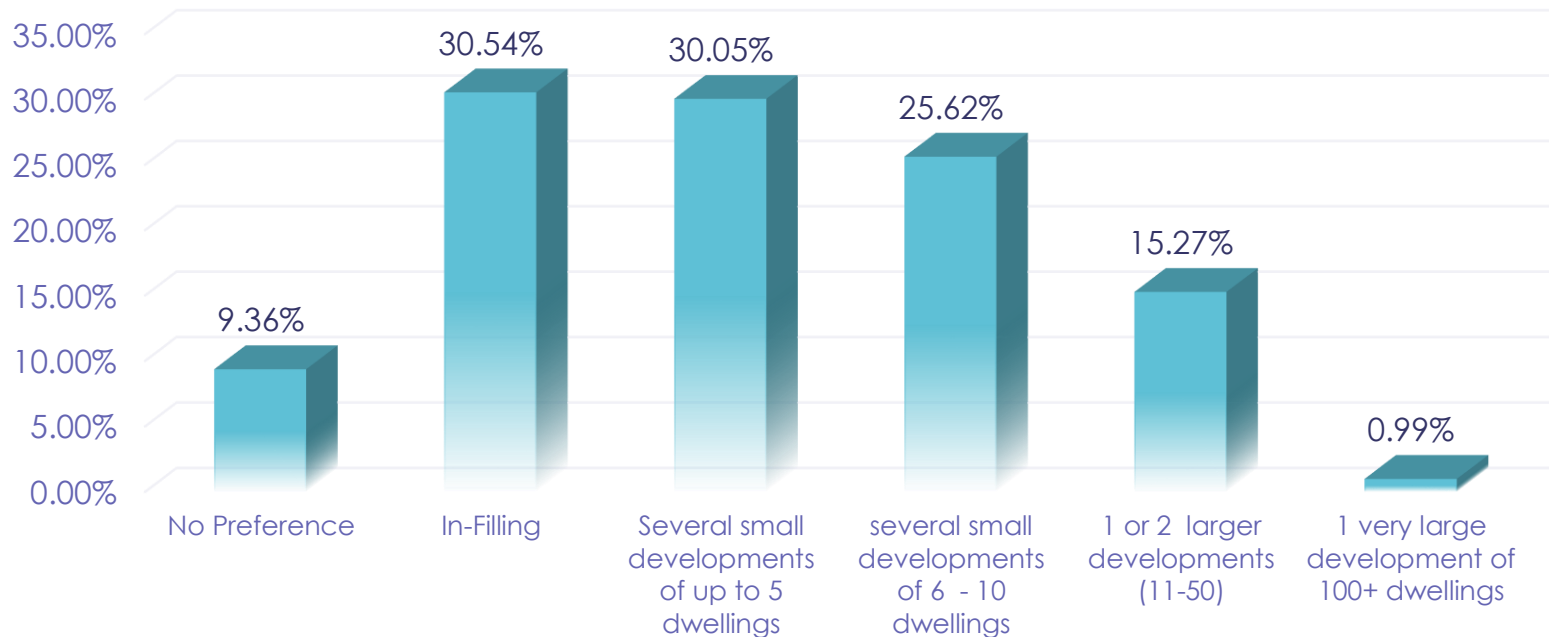

## TYPE OF DEVELOPMENT



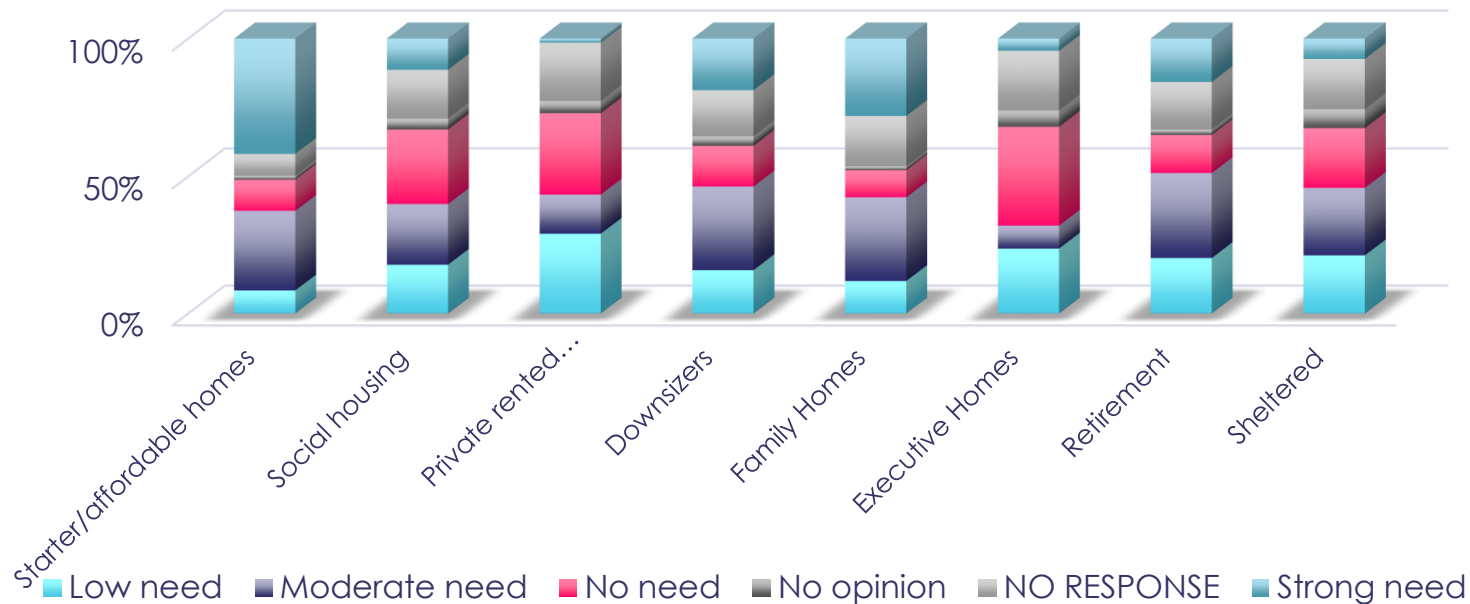

## PREDICTED HOUSING NEED



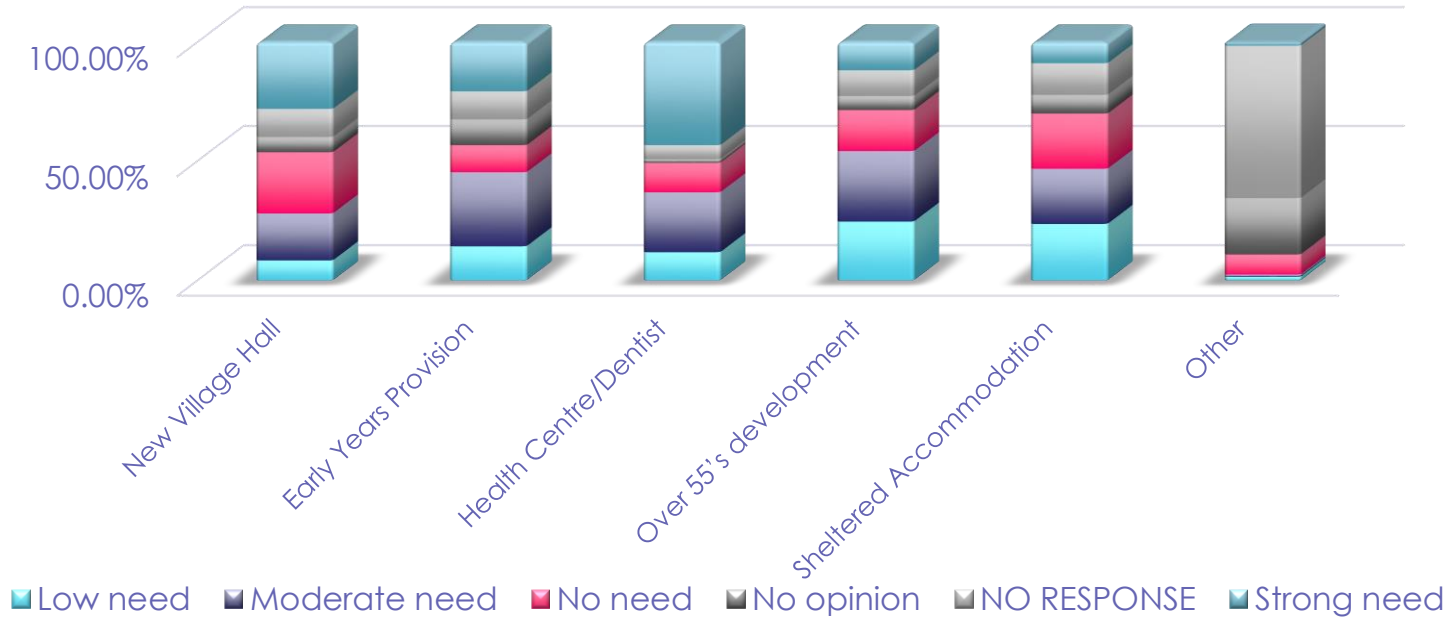

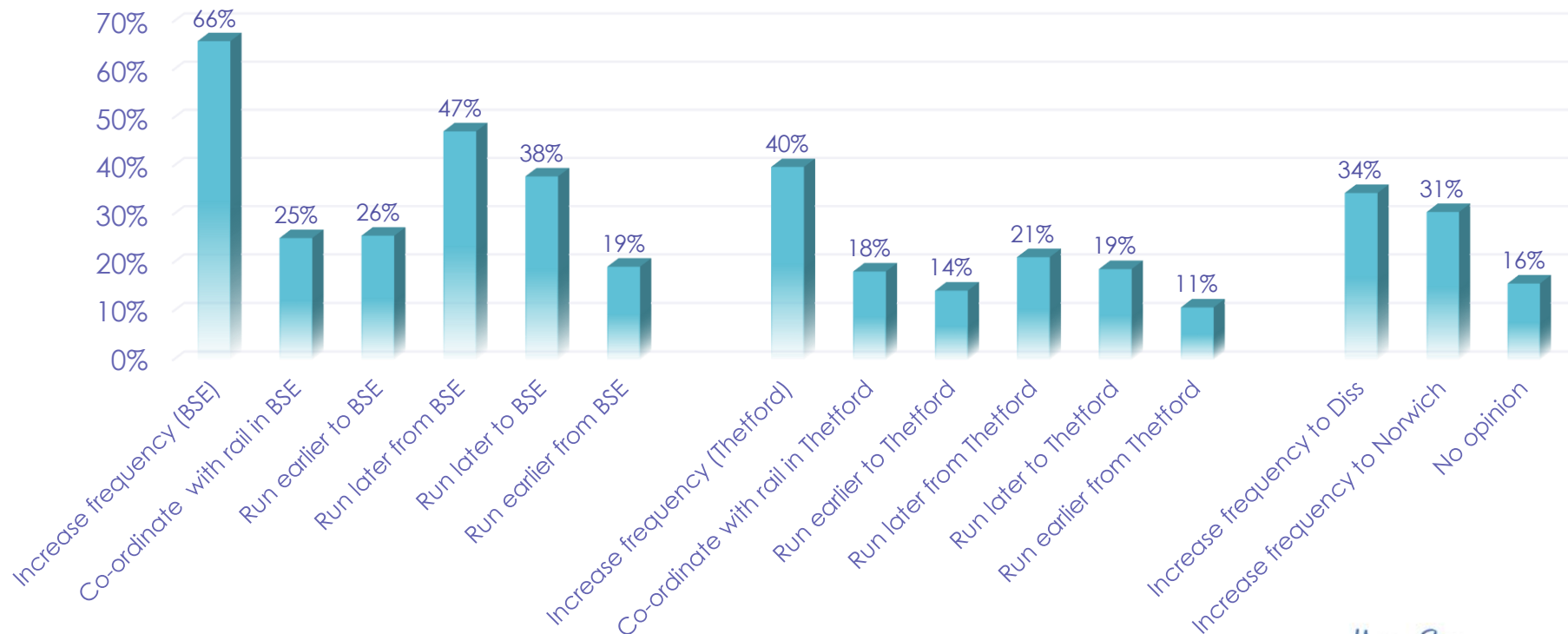

## ➤ Bus Services – perceived need

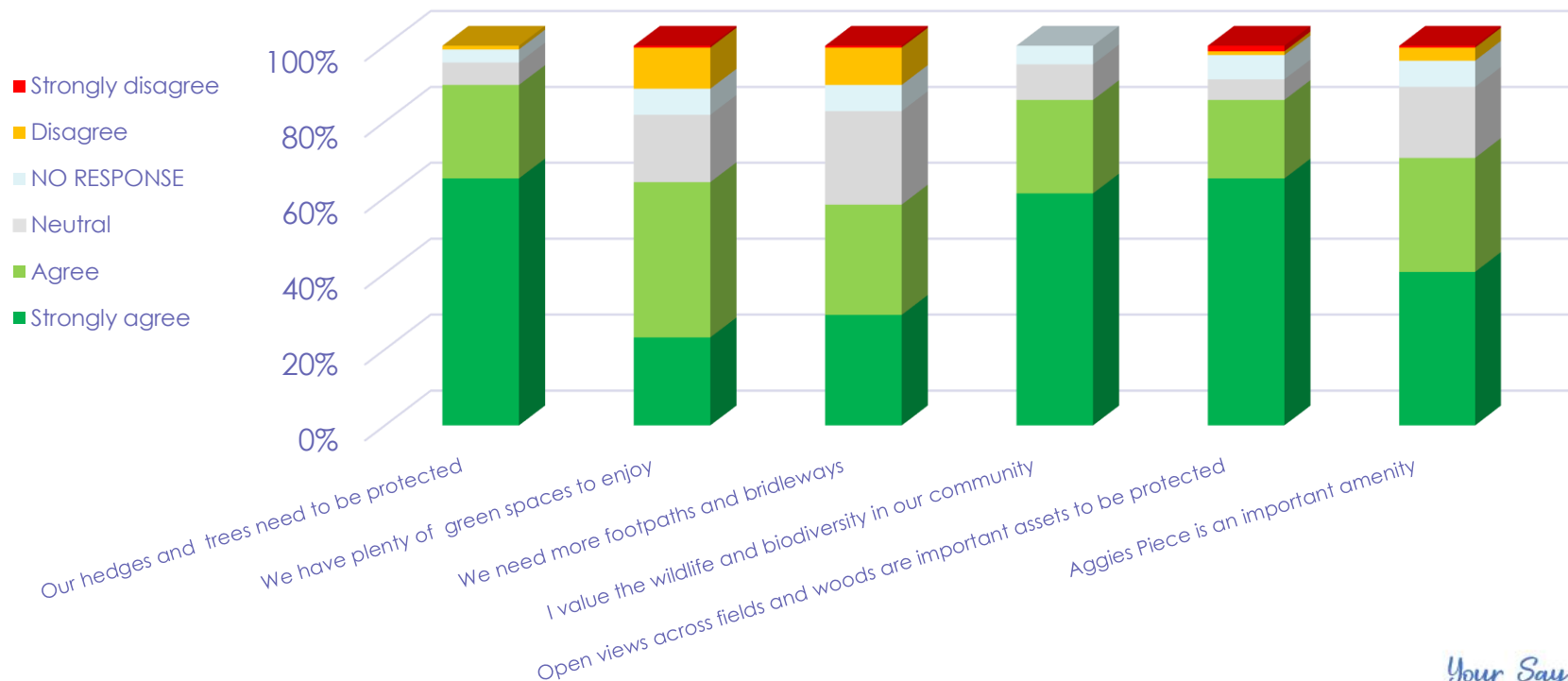

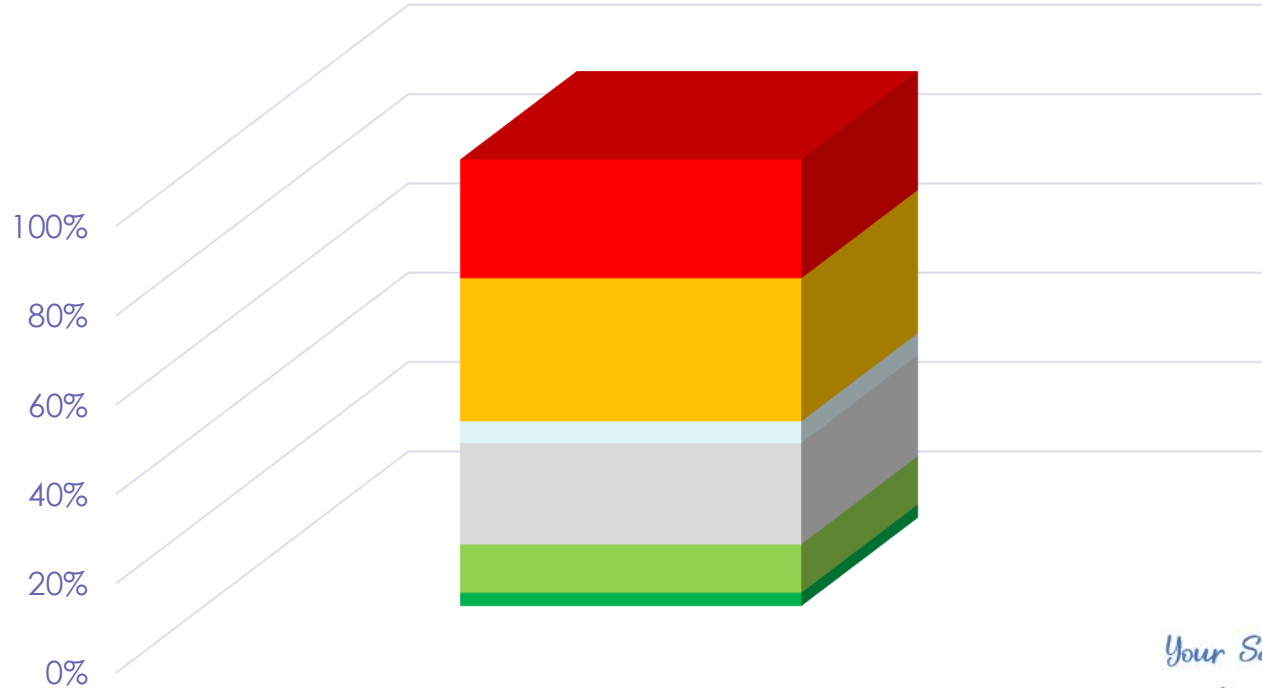

# Questionnaire Comments



"We had plenty of footpaths until stiles, bridges and access to tracks was stopped or removed without consultation.

I have lived in this area all my life and always had access to fields or tracks.

This is a nice village which is big enough already. other villages have had new village halls without money from new homes.

We don't have a big enough doctors as it is without new homes. The sewer drains on my estate already block up so without an updated system they will only get worse."

"Although agree that future development which harvest energy from natural sources, this is not carte blanche to create new development just because it is green but all developments should bear greenness in mind. Pub is valuable asset provided owners were more amenable to general public, needs to open more regularly. Village Hall is a valuable asset but needs to provide more events in the evening."

"Village Hall knock down and the affordable housing in the immediate area and build new houses there multiple occupancy rental accommodation also"

"We need 150 plus new homes. They could be built on the field behind Millfield. The large field opposite Hopton Road and Sandy Lane."

"Too many speeding cars through the village"

# Questionnaire Comments



"Parking outside village shop on road is a serious hazard. It causes you to drive down Church Road on the wrong side of the road unable to see if oncoming traffic is approaching. I am surprised no one has been killed. Need to stop parking out the front of the shop."

"Unfortunately when we look at Question A6 we know from the Hopkin development that views of the existing villages is not taken into consideration. We need development to be throughout the village, all areas, not just a continuation of the most recent one but the other side of the village also. If this is not done we will end up with a split community - a 'them and us.' Any monies from development must come to the village and not go elsewhere as is likely to, and has happened."

"Concerned about speeding cars on Pound Corner, towards Coney Weston."

"The bus timetables need to be adjusted and improved. There are many elderly people in the village who can no longer drive and the bus times are dreadful i.e. the bus into Bury arrives at 11 and the next bus back to Barningham is 11.30 (i.e. half an hour) The next bus after this is at 4 p.m. i.e. 5 hours! No elderly person can wander around Bury for 5 hours! There is a strong need for available transport to get to and from the doctor's surgery and clinic at Stanton. Everyone using this service would be willing to contribute towards the cost. There could be more daytime activities in the afternoon for elderly people, who don't like to be out at night in the winter months. Referring to the bus service - it is the elderly that use it more than others!"

"We moved to this village to have a view of the countryside not to look out onto houses. This is a village, not a town. We have one shop, one primary school, this village would not be able to cope with a lot of new builds - drainage, traffic, amenities etc..."
